

The Joys and Responsibilities of OCOD Membership.

There is no time like summer to remind me how lucky we are to have our Training Center. However, having our own space means we must all contribute to it's upkeep. One member responsibility is to **help keep the building clean** and in good order. So, this is a refresher on what is expected of each member regarding building upkeep.

1. Members will participate in a minimum of two cleaning days per year - one occurring January - June and the second July - December. If you live more than 45 minutes from the TC, you may vacuum, or clean bathrooms, or another assigned job when you are already there for class. If you only do **agility**, helping to clean and sort agility equipment counts for cleaning. Weekly set up and break down does not.
2. When present for cleaning (alone or with the group), each member will sign in on the **CLEANING** notebook that is on the Table near the front desk. This is the list we will use to determine who has met the cleaning requirement.

It takes a village to care for our building and we need everyone to do their part.

**OCOD'S DECEMBER TRIAL UPDATE
BY RALPH ORLANDO, TRIAL CHAIRMAN**

Hi All,

Gaining on us are our Rally/Obedience trials beginning with double Rally trials on December 8. Then for the weekend we will have our Saturday and Sunday double trials. The plan is to overlap the two Rally trials as we did in July with one starting at 8 Am in ring #3 and the second trial starting at 10:30 in ring #1. The early judge will be Ted McCall. In the later trial in ring #1 the judge is Dr. Norine Noonan (Norine ran the Rally Nationals this year. The idea behind this plan is to shorten the work day for each judge and also to shorten the day for the exhibitors by most likely a couple of hours.

Then on the weekend there will be all of the regular classes as well as some non-regular and random rewards classes. The last ring running on Sunday even with the double trials should end by about 2pm or so. On the weekend our judges will again be Ted McCall along with Dr. Robert and Cathryn Knight who will switch between Novice/Open & Utility. As always, the crating will be at a premium and so we ask for your help in removing your crate(s) if you are not showing. Crating for all 3 days is in ring #4 & #5 as well as the center aisle. If you are one who needs to remove a crate, you can take it home by Thursday December 8 or simply find a spot to store it neatly near the rear right door area.





Staffing these trials has changed slightly since covid appeared almost 3 years ago. Prior to covid 4 Stewards were the ring staff standard. There is a table steward who manages the paperwork for the judge. Then both Novice and Open require a figure 8 heeling pattern but no longer use stewards as figure 8 posts. So, the steward count has been reduced to 3 with two cones replacing the need for 2 people posts. So as a bare minimum 3 stewards but if we can get 4 this is a bonus plus.

Along with great judges, great facility and hospitality from our members, the job of the stewards very often ring high praise from our guest and from the judges. On the job training for those wanting to learn is also possible. I also suggest for new stewards to sign up for the match a week earlier or contact Ralph if you can come to a training class to be a practice steward. After all of that said you Judge will brief you before each trial begins.

Starting with the October club meeting there will be a sign up for stewards to volunteer for one or more days at these trials. The premium list for exhibitors has been proofed and just went out for entries.

As per the premium list the host hotel is the Country Inn & Suites by Radisson in Port Orange.

CHANGE TO STANDING RULES

As of January 1, 2024 the following Standing Rules have changed.

Page 4 MEMBERSHIP

Be sure your dues are paid by end of December or you will have to pay new price

9. MEMBERSHIP INITIATION FEE: \$50 Plus Membership Dues as listed below:

Junior Membership	\$20	Single Membership	\$50 \$35
Household Membership	\$45 \$50	Life Membership (25 years +)	-0-

A. A \$10.00 late fee will be added if not paid before the first day of January of each year.

B. If membership has lapsed more than 6 (six) months the late fee is \$25.00

C. The uppermost limits for dues shall not exceed \$150.00

D. Dues are payable on or before the first day of January of each year. Dues paid on new memberships accepted after September 1, will be considered current and paid for the following year. No member may vote whose dues are not paid for the current year. During the month of November, the Treasurer shall send to each member a statement of dues for the ensuing year by Chatter-Barks newsletter, e-mail, or electronic mail.

E. If membership has lapsed more than ~~1 year~~, 6 months it is a new membership.

F. The BOD may grant an additional 90 days to delinquent members in meritorious cases. They may not vote until dues are paid.

G. Members are required to help clean the building or work an event 1 (one) time each 6 (six) months to qualify for class discounts and 1/2 price Awards Banquet.

GENERAL MEETING

SEPTEMBER 11, 2023

President Michele Lemole called the meeting to order at 7:15pm. The sign in sheet had been passed around and 16 members were present. There was no correspondence.

Minutes of the last meeting were not read because they were published in the Chatterbarks newsletter.

Report of the Secretary: There were two new applications for membership: Ann-Marie Lyddane (S) Daytona Beach and Jon Glass (S) Deland. There was no correspondence.

Report of the Treasurer: We only brought in 5K last month so you guys have to work harder. Next month we will bring in more because of the trial.

Michele said tonight we will be talking about the website. We are going to revamp our website. We sought out a professional opinion and they thought that our website needed to be a little more user friendly and so we were going to hire someone to help us do that. Chris Franczek can help us maintain it she just doesn't do website design. So we would need someone to design it for us and that would cost upwards of \$2,000. We need to vote on that. Pat said we need our website rebuilt to current standards because a huge percentage of our new applicants for classes are using their phone to apply. Currently our website is not user friendly on a mobile phone and the big box stores websites are. Pat feels we can lose people's business that way. Nina said that our current website is not friendly with computers either. Michele called for a vote to update the website. A motion was made to vote for an update to the website and it was unanimous. Michele said we are going to change our literature once we change our website. On our business cards we will only have our club website and no phone numbers because phone numbers change over time and the cards have to be thrown out and replaced.

Michele said we will be having the end of the year dinner at Palmetto Club which is the same venue as last year. The date is December 4, 2023. Entrée choices are Prime Rib, Chicken, or Fish. The dinner cost is \$20 for members which includes the tip. Joan will take reservations at the October meeting 😊

Ralph refers people to OCODB.ORG for class information. He also noticed we were very short on poop-bags for both front and back areas and sent out a request. Nina brought a big bag tonight. Ralph asked if anyone had an issue with filling out the forms for the Jacksonville trial online? He said you couldn't sign it or pick out the classes you want to compete in. They had to fill them out longhand and Ralph scanned it and e-mailed it to her. This happened to some people entering the golden trial and their forms were not received. If you don't get any confirmation you should call to see if they have been received. Ralph brought up instructor hours. He has a new improved form which he really likes. Ralph would like instructors to ask if there are 1st responders or current or prior military in puppy or basic classes. They could end up with one free class if they followed the rules of the program and were firemen or women, police, and active or retired military. Call Ralph or see the information on the OCOD website. Ralph needs a corrected format for the month to month calendar to determine credits. Ralph's yearly records are used for future reference. We presently have a \$10 discount for humane society dogs.

Anna would like to remind us that the set up for the trial is on Thursday 9/14 at 3pm. The trial is on 9/15, 9/16, and 9/17. She still needs more volunteers.

Linda Hudak said instructors should keep their class pages current in the monthly class book. Instructors teaching monthly upper level classes pre-screen new students. Claire pre-qualifies new students for her Fun Agility class.

Michele asked if there was anything else....Joan motioned to adjourn, Renee seconded the motion.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:42pm
