

#### We are pleased to announce the 2022 AKC Trick Dog National Competition It's Virtual!!



The link to the entry form will be posted June 1, 2022. We are pleased to announce the AKC Trick Dog National Competition for 2022.

All AKC Trick Dogs who have earned the Elite Performer title by the entry opening date (July 1, 2022, 5:00 pm, EST) can enter this exciting annual event for trick dogs. The title must have been awarded by AKC before entering the competition.

Because the competition is virtual (i.e., the judging will be done via video), trick dogs everywhere can participate.

How it works: Submit a video to AKC of your dog's trick dog routine. The routine must be no longer than 6 minutes and may include props and music. The 6 minutes includes the time for moving props during the routine and performing the tricks. If you choose to give a speech at the beginning of your routine, this is counted in the 6 minutes.

You may use a new video, or a video previously submitted to AKC for review to earn your title. Videos that were entered in previous Virtual Tricks competitions may not be submitted again.


As is the case with all Elite Performer routines, there must be a theme or story. For this virtual competition, an audience is not required.

If you have more than one great routine, you may submit up to two videos (per dog) to the competition.

When: To enter, submit your video between July 1 and September 1, 2022. Three judges will judge the submissions and the winner will be announced in October 2022.

The winner and two semi-finalists of the 2022 AKC Trick Dog Competition will receive trophies. The winners will be featured in AKC media, and their videos will be on the AKC Trick Dog web page.

There will also be breed prizes and qualifying rosettes.

#### General Meeting

Chatter-Barks

The Meeting was called to order at 7:12pm by President Michele Lemole. The sign in sheet was passed around - 15 members were present. There were no guests.

Minutes of the last meeting were not read because they were published in the Chatterbarks. Wins and Brags were announced. Any new Wins and Brags should be submitted to Joan for the Chatterbarks.

Report of the Secretary: There were no new applications for membership and there was no correspondence.

Report of the Treasurer: Renee asked that we do not take any Canadian checks for classes. It costs us \$36 to process the check.

Michele started the meeting and thanked everyone for coming. Ralph said that Diane Schultz was appointed to be the new AKC Obedience Director. Renee announced she is having a meeting on Saturday April 9<sup>th</sup> at 12:30pm. It is for instructors and assistants or anyone else that would like to train to teach. We have lost one of our basic teachers temporally because he is training his dog now. Michele says it really takes a village so if you would like to teach a class you will get lots of instruction on how to do it and we will let you work with another instructor. We also need people that are willing to assist an instructor. If you've been thinking about it this is the time to step up. Ralph said this week is camp week for Halifax Humane Society. Ralph is going to represent therapy dogs and give a little demo. If anyone would like to do this please give Halifax a call.

Michele is letting us know about DOCOF which stands for Dog Obedience Clubs of Florida. We will need people interested in competing and someone to be the group leader for our team. The location will be in Tampa. This year DOCOF will be AKC sanctioned so you would be able to earn a title. There will be more information in the newsletter.

Our club is working with another club to hold Fastcat trials and we are going to have 6 more events this year at Dog Sports Unlimited which is in New Smyrna Beach. The game is a lot of fun for you and your dog. It's a hundred yard dash and they also use a lure to get your dog to run towards you. They're very nice and will show you how to do it when you're new to the sport. We will have a club "try it day" and when that is scheduled we will let you know. It's very easy to learn your first Title in Fastcat.

We are having a Scent Work trial and before the trial we will have a match the weekend prior to the trial on Saturday April 16<sup>th</sup>. Terrie is in charge of the volunteers for the Scent Work trial scheduled for April 22, 23, and 24. She needs a minimum of 9 people Friday morning and 9 people Friday afternoon. She will need the same amount of people for Saturday morning, Saturday afternoon, Sunday morning, and Sunday afternoon. Terrie will need more volunteers to put together boxes before the trial. Call Terrie if you can help.

Pat Dean will soon be taking over Linda Brendlinger's job of sending out information for the club. Linda will make an announcement when she switches over to Pat. We need people to help clean the building. Volunteering is part of your duties of being part of the club and that's how you get your classes at a discount. We have allowances for people that do other cleaning jobs at other times. Make sure you write your name in the cleaning book so you get credit for your work. Online registration will be in Puppy and Basic classes starting April 1<sup>st</sup>. There is a spot where you can notate on the registration that you have class credits and when you come to class bring your credits to give to the instructor. Renee asked that we do not take Canadian Checks because they cost us extra money to process. Renee said just ask for cash.

While doing Fastcat at Silver Sands January trial, Adria Kelley's little dog Lucy was injured when she took a tumble while running in an area that had ruts in it. The vet cost over \$500 and she was told Lucy cannot run for 4-6 weeks. Adria said she compounded it because she didn't know her dog really had an injury. She noticed Lucy was off but she didn't know why she was off and took her to the vet last week because she started developing other issues like the back injury. Who knows if she will ever run again. They had walked the track and filled in ruts as best they could. Adria was asking if we would reconsider having fastcat at that location next year. Adria said part of this was because Lucy was little and her dog will never run anywhere except Dog Sports Unlimited because of the possibility of injury. Terrie mentioned about surface problems at DSU if there has been rain in the area the day before you are considering going to run.

Terrie wants to hold an open house day for the club. This would need lots of volunteers for showing groups around and club members to demonstrate all the wonderful training we do here. Michele suggested Terrie make an official written proposal, structured like a business plan, with all the details to present to the board.
